Job Title: Teacher

Overall Responsibilities:

- 3. To plan, prepare and deliver a range of lessons maintaining a high-quality learning environment.
- 4. To provide timely assessments, appropriate feedback and recording of students' progress, development and attainment in order that students understand how to improve their learning.
- 5. To contribute to the achievement of retention and success targets for courses that you teach.
- 6. To be pro-active and involved in curriculum development within the department.
- 7. To participate in arrangements for performance review and staff development activities and events.
- 8. To organise subject related extracurricular activities, such as external speakers, trips and visits.
- 9. To apply and maintain Health and Safety guidelines across the department.
- 10. To participate in departmental meetings and others as required by Line manager
- 11. To produce written student progress reports and participate in parents' evenings.
- 12. To contribute to the student enrichment programme.
- 13. To promote The Bedford Sixth Form at Open Evenings and other promotional events.
